1. Responsive Prayer 1 is for use in the morning. Responsive Prayer 2 is for use at other times of the day and before travel.

L Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal,

C have mercy and hear us.

C Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those
who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial
and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours,
now and forever. Amen

OR **C** Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those
who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
and the power, and the glory,
forever and ever. Amen

C I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended into hell.*
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen

L O Lord, I cry to you for help.

C In the morning my prayer comes before you.

L Give me the joy of your saving help again,

C and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit.

L Let my mouth be full of your praise

C and your glory all the day long.

L Every day will I bless you,

C and praise your name forever and ever.

L Awesome things will you show us in your righteousness,

C O God of our salvation, O hope of all the ends of the earth and of the seas that
are far away.

L Bless the Lord, O my soul,

C and all that is within me, bless his holy name.

L He redeems my life from the grave,

C and crowns me with mercy and lovingkindness.

*Or: He descended to the dead.

L Lord, hear my prayer,

C and let my cry come before you.

2. The PRAYER OF THE DAY is said; the salutation may precede it. Additional prayers may be said also. The prayer beginning, "We give thanks to you . . .," is always said.

L The Lord be with you.

C And also with you.

L Let us pray. . . .

C Amen

L We give thanks to you, heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have protected us through the night from all danger and harm. We ask you to preserve and keep us, this day also, from all sin and evil, that in all our thoughts, words, and deeds we may serve and please you. Into your hands we commend our bodies and souls and all that is ours. Let your holy angels have charge of us, that the wicked one have no power over us. (265)
