

EVENING PRAYER

Vespers

A simplified form of Evening Prayer, suitable for family or small group devotion, is indicated by the small circle.

1. The SERVICE OF LIGHT may be used to begin Evening Prayer. The service may be begun with a procession in which a large, lighted candle is carried to its stand in front of the congregation.



- 6. The psalm prayer appropriate to each psalm follows the silence.


• 10. The GOSPEL CANTICLE is sung.



For the peace from above, and for our salvation, let us pray to the Lord.






For the peace of the whole world, for the well-being of the Church of God, and for the unity of all, let us pray. . . to the Lord.

For those who work to bring peace, justice, health, and protection in this and every place, let us pray to the Lord.










For favorable weather, for an abundance of the fruits of the earth, and for peaceful times, let us pray to the Lord.











For the faithful who have gone before us and are at rest, let us give thanks. to the Lord.

15. A HYMN is sung.


16. The SERMON. Following the sermon one of these prayers is said.

- P Almighty God, grant to your Church your Holy Spirit and the wisdom which comes down from heaven, that your Word may not be bound but have free course and be preached to the joy and edifying of Christ's holy people, that in steadfast faith we may serve you and in the confession of your name may abide to the end; through Jesus Christ our Lord. (250)
- OR Delivery Lord God, you have OR Delivery Lord, we thank you called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. (251)
 - that you have taught us what you would have us believe and do. Help us by your Holy Spirit, for the sake of Jesus Christ, to keep your Word in pure hearts, that thereby we may be strengthened in faith, perfected in holiness, and comforted in life and in death. (252)
